Salt Dough Turkey Keepsake

Supplies Used: 1 cup flour 1/2 cup salt 1/2 cup warm water rolling pin wax paper craft paints (author used acrylic) paintbrushes

Instructions:



1. Combine flour, salt, and water to form the dough. Sprinkle some flour on the wax paper and roll out to approximately 1/2 inch thickness.

2. Have your child spread fingers apart and help them make an impression in the dough.

3. Place the print on a cookie sheet and bake on low, 200° for about an hour.

4. When dry, paint the entire surface white, then paint the thumb and palm brown. Paint each finger a different color. Paint eyes and feet, and your done!

*Author ended up using black and white puffy paint for the eyes and orange for the legs, but regular paint would work too.

We thank you for your continued patience and dedication in following the 2020 COVID-19 guidance and protocols over the past few months. We recognize it has been a very challenging time for all and appreciate all that you do in helping to keep our communities safe.

- While business is being conducted virtually as much as possible, we are available in the office, Monday – Friday 8AM – 5PM BY APPOINTMENT ONLY. To make an appointment to come to the office, please call us at (229) 333-0539.
- Amenities Update: As you may be aware, the playgrounds and dog parks are reopened. The attached waiver and release of liability, and assumption of risk form must be completed and signed by all adults in the household prior to use of any amenity. Once received, each member of your household over the age of two (2) will receive a silicone bracelet that must be worn at all times when using any amenity.
- All URGENT and EMERGENCY Maintenance requests need to be called in! Placing an Urgent or Emergency request through the website or Resident Portal App is automatically prioritized as ROUTINE. You can call anytime, 24/7 at 229-333-0539.
- Balances Due: All balances due must be paid in full within 30 days

(with the exception of Payment Plans; please follow according to arrangement). Payments can be made via your Resident Portal App, by making an appointment to drop off a check or Money Order to the office, OR by dropping of check or Money Order to the drop box located at the Community Center in Quiet Pines (please call the office to notify us a payment has been dropped off).

- Please continue Mowing and Edging your fenced yards! Residents with fenced backyards are responsible for mowing the fenced area, as well as edging/trimming along fence line.
- Please notify the office if you are going out of town for 7 Days or more! Per your Resident Lease, if you will be away from your home for 7 days or more, please contact us to let us know what dates you will be gone. If you have a friend, neighbor, coworker, or family member looking in on your home while you are away, be sure to leave their information with us as well so we know they have permission to enter your home.

Resident Guidelines Reminder of the Month -November 2020

8. PROPERTY POLICIES

8.13 Holiday Decorations/Outside Lighting

Outside lighting must be Underwriters Laboratories (UL) approved and factory listed for outside use. Running electric cords through windows and doors, or across heating ducts or vent systems is prohibited, as this causes a fire safety hazard. All exterior lighting must be "GFI" protected. Residents are reminded that homes have limited amp circuits and care must be taken to prevent overloading.

Holiday decorations and outside lighting are prohibited from being placed higher than the edge of the roof gutter. The use of staples, nails, screws, or other mechanical fasteners to attach decorations or lighting to the homes and associated structures is prohibited. Plastic clip-on hooks may be commercially obtained and used to attach decorative lighting, garlands etc. Attachment of anything to vinyl siding is prohibited.

Additionally, electrical decorations must be unplugged when Residents are away from the home. Christmas lighting may not be erected before Thanksgiving and must be removed no later than January 10th. Outside decorative lights are to be turned off no later than midnight, except on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve, when they are allowed to remain on overnight. Outside lights are not authorized during daylight hours.

Decorative lighting for other occasions such as Halloween is authorized but cannot be put up earlier than one month prior to the occasion and must be removed no later than one week after the occasion. All decorative lighting must be UL or FM approved for either indoor or outdoor use.

All live Christmas trees must be kept watered to reduce the fire hazard. If the pine needles begin to fall off or if branches break when bent, the tree must be removed from the residence. Use extreme care while decorating live trees and use UL approved lights that are not frayed nor have missing lights that may cause a fire. There will be a designated time for tree removal that will be communicated yearly in our newsletter and website.
